#### **Evaluation**

Accommodation The organizers had to changes hotels the last

days before the competition. This caused big problems, meaning accessibility problems for some players. These players had to change hotels

(difficult for the players).

Venue Very nice venue, 24 competition tables and 16

practice tables, one of the best venues for PTT

tournaments ever.

Transport The transport system between hotel and venue

had to be changed from day 0 – the practice day – because of problems with the buses, promised by the city of Brasilia. Severe problems day 0 – with

no transport or very late transport.

During the competition days the transport was organized by taxis and mini-vans. It worked quite

good.

The transport from hotel to airport worked quite

good.

Meals Very good meals – high quality.

Water supplies Problem area day 1 of the tournament. The

organizers could not provide water until 10:45 day 1 of the tournaments, causing severe

problems for the players. Water supplies was ok

from late afternoon day 1.

Referee International level – professional work

Deputy Referee International level – professional work

Umpires Good - international, national and regional levels

Computer person Very good - professional work!

Time schedule The tournament followed time schedule 100 %

Ball boys Not enough ball boys; some of the umpires had

to work as ball boys

Language Only some of the organizers spoke good English

- caused some communication problems

Organisation Competent organisation, but too few people

involved. Some of the organizers had to work on

many areas, stressful for them.

Volunteers Too few volunteers

Medal presentation Very good medal presentation for the open,

singles and teams

Flexibility The organizers showed a lot of flexibility, among

others:

Accepting late arrivals, among them a team of 8 players from Poland (the team from Poland were very happy to be allowed to compete)
Moving some unhappy teams from one hotel to

another, due to access problems to bathrooms for wheel-chair athletes (some of the individuals

had to wait 1 day to be moved..)

Conclusion Brazilian Open had the possibilities to make a very good Factor 40

tournament. A nice city, perfect climate, perfect venue, nice hotels, short distance airport – hotels – venue, experienced table tennis organisation, nice

medal presentation, good food.

The problems areas were mainly a too small organisation, too few ball boys and volunteers, late change of hotels and transport system, slow water supplies

day 1.
