	their tournament credit in a cost effective way and reduce the challenges
	which may be experienced in heat of $33^{\circ}C$
	2. The natural light in the training hall be covered up
	3. A interim arrangement be made for wi-fi access in the competition hall for
	the TD and referee
	4. Consideration be given to having some teams in each hotel to be able to
	compare accessibility issues
	5. Consideration be given to having some smaller wheelchairs available for
	players to get access to the bathrooms on request
