Accommodation: Alamaken Plaza Hotel****

Hotel was accessible for wheelchair users but not completely suitable. They had some problems for showers, because number of rooms for class 1 and 2 were limited. In addition, it was difficult for the other wheelchair users. The hotel had two lifts with small space only for one wheelchair so the players had to wait for using that.

About 25 minutes from venue by bus.





Breakfast and dinner was served in the hotel, with a lot of choice for dinner and was good, but breakfast, was not international with few choices.

Lunch boxes were served directly in playing venue.

Participants:

14 nations from 3 continents: Asia, Europe, Africa were present.

79 men 13 women

14 leaders and supporting staff

Total: 106 participants

Four countries did not show up: NIG, QAT, LBA, and GHANA

Transport:

Organized good, by big bus with lift for wheelchairs and many smaller Vans, Mini buses accessible. Transport was generally on schedule during the tournament, and request when needed.

There were not known problems with transportation.

Transport between the airport-hotel-airport organized well.

Classifications:

Two classifiers have tested new players and submitted this report:

During classification the 2 appointed classifiers were supported by local international technical. Classifier Mr. Marwan Dia. His Technical expertise and Arabic understanding was extremely helpful.

The classification area was well prepared.

Thanks to the TD and classifier Dr. Bahman Zand. The paper work was prepared as well. A problem was the Arabic mix of given name and Surname will also other family names.

Wish the help of passports this was well corrected.

This is important:

Only if the player is in the complete with the right names, that athlete receives the right amount of ranking points.

These were 17 athletes on the classification list. Only one did not assume, so 16 were classified.

Of these 16 athletes 5 were under review:

- two went up 1 class
- one went 1 class down
- two did not change class

There was one protest classification who did not change. The total these were to new players for classification:

- Six of them was up 1 class
- One player did so sown 2 classes
- Three had the right class gotten in the national classification.

Conclusion:

The classification was well prepared

The out of 16 athletes changed classes

This is in calculation 62.5%

Keeping our competitions fair still do need classification.
