

## **2014 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS**

## **BEIJING: 6 TO 15 SEPTEMBER 2014**

**Introduction:** the Selection Committee met in La Louvière, Belgium from 7 to 8 March 2014.

The Selection Committee was chaired by the Selection Officer, Nico Verspeelt, and comprised:

- Dorte Darfelt (Chairperson, PTT)
- Georgios Seliniotakis (Technical Delegate)
- Jolanda Paardekam (Players' Committee Chairperson)
- Alison Burchell (Director: Operations and PTT)

**Criteria:** as with previous selection meetings, the Committee confirmed the criteria as used in previous selections including:

- a)Eligibility: in terms of the qualification process, a tournament credit was set at:
  - i) 150 for Europe including the regional championships.

ii) 90 for the other regions including the regional championships.

The players achieving the tournament credit were confirmed by the Selection Officer, the Webmaster and the rating consultant. All regions held regional championships including the newly established Oceania region.

- b)Submission of entries from the national association: various documents were confirmed as being submitted by the national association. Unfortunately, the entry from the Kenya Table Tennis Association (the president and secretary general nominating themselves) for Disabled was not submitted by the Kenya Table Tennis Association.
- c) Increasing the number of teams: this was considered in terms of ensuring maximum benefit for players at the World Championships i.e. that they can, where possible, play both singles and team events.
- d)Universality and increasing the number of countries: the domination of Europe continues both in terms of numbers of players qualified and the number of tournaments organised in that continent although there is an improvement with Asia. Thus, in order to promote the development of table tennis world wide, ensuring participation from countries from other continents was considered.
- e)Potential: to encourage the participation of countries with new players, this area was also considered to ensure continuity.
- f) Quality: underpinning all the above is the need to ensure quality at the World Championships.
- g)Guaranteed host wild card requests: the host country is guaranteed 4 wild cards (one each in men and women standing and sitting classes and at the discretion of the Selection Committee).
- h)Medical and other issues: a few players had submitted medical reports giving reasons why they had not been able to participate in events and thus

did not meet the tournament credit requirement. This was investigated in detail including whether the second entry for various tournaments included the player in question.

On this basis, several players were not considered particularly as they had not met the eligibility requirement.

**Context:** prior to the selection process, the selection slots accepted by countries (295) were reflected as follows:

The total number of slots available for the World Championships is 330 with 295 slots being accepted in the pre-selection process. This left 35 wild cards to be allocated against 82 applications.

**Selections:** the host country wild cards were allocated (women's standing, men's sitting and standing classes) as part of the process. All selections were checked for eligibility in terms of the tournament credit and that an application for a wild card had been submitted where the motivation was considered.

In relation to SM11, 4 players are under review at the tournament to happen in Hungary. With 2 wild cards available, these were allocated but should any player not have their classification confirmed, the number of slots in the SM11 event would consequently be reduced.

**Teams:** the combination of classes in team events is due to the total number of team entries predicted for the World Championships noting, however, that the situation may change after countries confirm by 15 April 2014.

The Selection Committee was able to add 4 countries to the table tennis competition including 1 for the first time (SLE) and 2 for the second time (CHI and MAS) and Indonesia made it this time on its own merits, having received a wild card in 2012. The number of slots, being an event under the ITTF, was increased by 10% over the previous world championships, and all singles classes filled the quota allocated except for SF4 and SF5. Overall in the team events, the number of teams fluctuates over 2010 per class although men's team 1 and 2 has successfully been separated.
