There is seating for up to 9 100 spectators as well as seating on the 2 nd floor
for the disabled. This could be the area identified for meals.
However, there is only 1 elevator which can take 4 wheelchairs maximum.
There is enough space for a sealed off area on the competition level for
wheelchair players.
There is a PA system in place.
The temperature can be controlled.
On the ground floor, there are wheelchair accessible toilets on each corner.
The whole building is a smoke-free zone.
Dight next doon to Vermin is Ditarral which can be accessed his the annual
Right next door to Yeomju is Bitgoeul which can be accessed via the ground
level over a small street or via the 2 nd floor of Yeomju to the 1 st floor of
Bitgoeul also via the small street.
Bitgoeul is 1 655m ² of competition area.
It has capacity for 1 450 spectators.
Yeomju would be used for competition and Bitgoeul as the training venue.
